STATUTORY SIGNAGE FOR ECU CITY CAMPUS

PROJECT OVERVIEW

When the new ECU City Campus opened its doors to students in February 2026, it represented one of the most ambitious education infrastructure projects in Western Australia. Behind the scenes of the striking architecture and cutting-edge learning spaces was an enormous and complex statutory signage program delivered by Signs & Lines.

The scale of the project was immense. Thousands of individual signs, spanning multiple buildings and levels, were produced and installed to ensure the campus met strict compliance, accessibility, and safety requirements. Signs were manufactured locally in Western Australia and installed by the company's specialist team.

Working in close collaboration with builder Multiplex and design agency Buro North, the Signs & Lines team delivered a complete statutory signage solution that met rigorous building standards while integrating seamlessly into the campus environment..

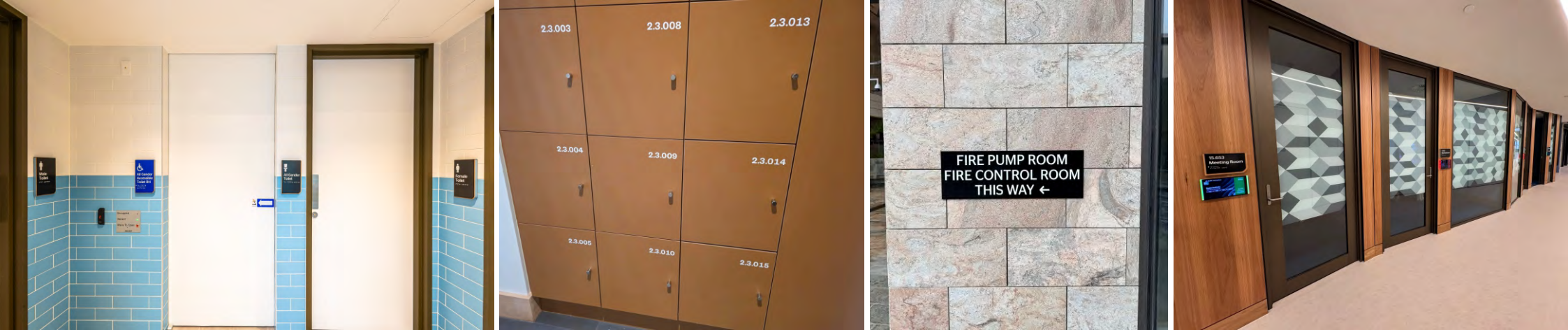

THE CHALLENGE

Statutory signage is often one of the most extensive yet overlooked elements of a major construction project. It must satisfy:

- Australian Standards compliance
- Accessibility requirements
- Building certification regulations
- Safety communication across complex spaces

At ECU City, the challenge was amplified by:

- Multiple buildings (North and South towers)
- Signage required from Ground Floor through Level 7 North and Level 9 South including additional gallery floors
- A large variety of specialised sign types
- Tight construction timelines leading up to the campus opening

Each sign also needed to meet the exacting specifications established by Multiplex and the design framework developed by Buro North.

SCOPE OF WORK

Signs & Lines delivered a comprehensive statutory signage package across the campus. The main sign types are described below.

SAFETY AND PRIVACY GLASS DECALS

Across both the North and South buildings, safety and privacy decals were installed across all levels.

SAFETY DECALS

- Vinyl cut banding applied to glass surfaces – 695 lineal metres of 100mm banding
- Installed from Ground Floor to Level 7
- Ensured visibility of glazing to prevent accidental collisions

PRIVACY DECALS

- Digitally printed white in reverse 1500mm high– over 600 lineal metres in total
- Applied to the internal face of glass panels
- Installed throughout both buildings

These elements combined safety compliance and provide privacy to meeting rooms with a clean architectural finish.

ACCESSIBILITY SIGNAGE

Accessibility signage played a major role in ensuring the campus is inclusive for all users. Installed signage included:

- Accessible Entrance & accessible lift signs
- Over 100 Hearing Loop and Infrared Hearing signs with braille elements

These signs ensure clear communication for people with hearing and mobility requirements.

SAFETY AND HAZARD SIGNAGE

A wide range of statutory safety signs were installed throughout the campus, including:

- Twenty three Danger signs including High Voltage warnings
- Twelve Restricted Access signs
- Campus-wide Entry and Exit statutory signage – 167 in total
- Statutory Door signage vinyl cut text each specifically numbered – 141 signs
- Statutory Door signage black plates with vinyl cut text each specifically numbered - 128 signs
- Height Clearance sign bars for parking areas

These signs provide critical information for students, staff, contractors, and emergency services.

FIRE SAFETY SIGNAGE

Fire compliance signage is a critical requirement for building certification. Hundreds of signs were installed across the facility, including:

- Fire Room Access signs
- Fire Hydrant signage
- Fire Control signage
- Fire Safety Door identification – over 600 in total

Each sign was produced to strict regulatory standards to support emergency response procedures.

VINYL DOOR DECALS

Examples include room identification such as:

- IS.GA01 Cleaners Store
- IN.BB08 Playhouse Store

GENERAL DOOR SIGNAGE

- 600mm wide × 80mm high panels
- Satin black painted finish
- White vinyl lettering applied

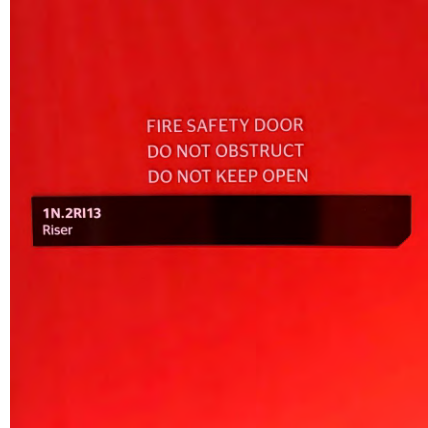
These were used throughout front-of-house areas to maintain consistency with the campus design language.

AMENITIES SIGNAGE

Toilet signage was installed across every floor and building, providing clear identification and ensuring accessibility compliance. Given the scale of the campus, this resulted in over two hundred individual amenity signs produced and installed.

LOCKER NUMBERS

A total quantity of 2070 locker numbers and designator locker numbers, each one cut vinyl with specific numbering.

PRODUCTION AND INSTALLATION

All signage was produced in the dedicated facility of Signs & Lines and installed by the company's experienced on-site installation teams. Managing production for thousands of individual signs required precise coordination between design approvals, manufacturing schedules, and on-site construction timelines.

THE IMPORTANCE OF STATUTORY SIGNAGE

Statutory signage is not simply decorative - it is fundamental to the safe operation of a building.

Without compliant statutory signage:

- Buildings cannot receive final certification
- Occupants lack critical safety information
- Emergency services may face operational delays

At the ECU City Campus, the signage program ensures that students, staff, and visitors can navigate the facility safely and confidently from day one.

PROJECT OUTCOME

The completion of the statutory signage program represented a major milestone in the delivery of the ECU City campus.

Through close collaboration with Multiplex and Buro North, Signs & Lines successfully delivered one of the largest statutory signage installations undertaken for an education facility in Western Australia. The project management team performed an outstanding job to co-ordinate works with thousands of signs installed across multiple buildings and seven levels.

THE FINAL WRAP

The completed statutory signage transforms the ECU City campus into a compliant and functional facility. As outlined, thousands of signs are a critical enabler of campus supporting the vibrant infrastructure in a very important way.
